Review of Fees and Charges 2022/23 and 2023/24

Decisions

The Health and Community Engagement, Neighbourhood Services and Community Safety, Planning Policy and Economic Development, Resources, and Street Scene, Parks and Open Spaces Portfolio Holders:

- approved the proposed amendments to 2022/23 fees and charges from 1 January 2023, as set out in Appendix 1 of the report.
- agreed that the proposed fees and charges, as set out in Appendix 1 of the report, for the 2023/24 financial year be approved and implemented from 1 April 2023.
