Good afternoon,

After reviewing the attached TEN application for a Young Farmers Club event in a field adjacent to Myerscough Colleague farm St Michael's road on 25<sup>th</sup> June to 26<sup>th</sup> June 2023. I have also taken in to consideration the submitted site management, Lancashire Federation of Young Farmers' clubs social event guidance and Guidance for All Lancashire Federation Clubs & regions for hosting social events.

Based on the information provided, I would have to object to this application. I feel that the described event will cause public nuisance specifically due to the likely impact of noise and ASB on the surrounding area and nearby residential properties. Below I have broken down my reasoning into specific areas.

### Noise

Having read through the documentation provided, specifically the events management plan and the TEN application. The proposed event is for a marquee and DJ playing music from 7pm on the 25<sup>th</sup> June till 1am on the 26<sup>th</sup> June, although the applicant states that this will not be "live" music it will still be amplified recorded music. According to the events management plan, the organisers have set out a noise limit of 95dB which will be monitored via mobile phone app. I have serious concerns about this as, In my view this means a significant amount of amplified noise will be generated, as sound will be emitted from late at night in an area where the background sound levels will be lower as the night goes on. Meaning amplified noise will be more noticeable, and likely to negatively impact on the surrounding area, and given that there are residential properties nearby there is the potential for a noise nuisance to arise the later this event goes on. Consideration has also been given to the impact of noise from a significant number of vehicles arriving and leaving the site late at night and noise from up to 499 revellers/patrons on site at any one time.

### ASB

As has been previously mentioned consideration has been to the impact of up to 499 revellers/patrons arriving and leaving the site, given that a private security firm has been hired for the event. I have some confidence in the site ability to address issues arising on site, but once the attendees leave the site there is the possibility of anti-social behaviour arising in the wider area. Particularly in and around the immediate sites entrances and exits, where existing residential properties nearby could be affected.

Ultimately all of the above could be addressed with appropriate conditions to prevent public nuisance from arising, however it is not possible to condition Temporary Event Notices. I have therefore advised the

applicant (Hazel Stansfield) to consider submitting a premises licence instead, where appropriate conditions for noise and ASB can be required as part of the premise licence. I would also suggest that if this event goes ahead it should go to WYSAG (WYRE SAFETY ADVISORY GROUP) and it would appear that this event has not been raised with the group for their input.
