Dear Licensing Officer,

Further to my letter dated 23 March, I am now putting my objections forward regarding the revised above application mad by Topsy Frog LTD.

My concerns remain the same as the revised application has increased its proposed opening hours for Fridays and Saturdays from 12.00 to 00.00, and that New Year Eve extends to New Year Day closing time. As a resident on the street, living just 3 doors away I am extremely worried on how this proposal will impact negatively on my daily life and mental and physical health. Also, for my neighbours too.

- 1 The premises are in a residential area, and the building itself is adjoining an occupied bungalow. The application for recorded music and the sale of alcohol every day of the week. My worry is that this will cause noise and possible behaviour disturbance, which will have detrimental effects for residents of the neighbourhood.
- 2 This is an area where families live and children play. A residential area is not the place for public bar, it will affect daily life for its neighbours, as an outside area has been paved presumably for drinking and smoking. The music and drinking will not be confined to the inside only. Residents should be able to go in and out of their homes without the constant disturbance from the sound of music and drinking both day and night.
- 3 The premises are near to a local high school. Many of the children congregate in the area after school on their way home, as the trams and bus stop are nearby. It is inappropriate that young impressionable people should be seeing public drinking so openly at the end of a residential street.
- 4 The roads in this area are narrow making parking difficult already. The possible increase in traffic is of concern to me both for additional parking, taxis loading and unloading customers day and night. This will cause additional noise and disturbance for the residents. Indeed as will the general running of the premises, with deliveries and maintenance before and after the opening hours.

I hope that you will take my concerns seriously, and will deny the application for this premises.
