Statement of Accounts 2014/15 (Post Audit)

1. Purpose of report

- 1.1 To approve the Council's published Statement of Accounts, following the completion of the audit, for the financial year 2014/15.

2. Outcomes

- 2.1 Evidence that the Council produces accounts in accordance with relevant standards and timetables, supported by comprehensive working papers and promotes external accountability.
- 2.2 Compliance with the requirements of the Accounts and Audit Regulations.

3. Recommendation

- 3.1 Members are requested to approve the Council's Statement of Accounts 2014/15.

4. Background

- 4.1 The Accounts and Audit Regulations 2011 require the Council's responsible financial officer to certify that the accounts 'present a true and fair view of the financial position' for the 2014/15 financial year by the 30 June 2015. The Council is then formally required to approve and publish the Statement of Accounts no later than 30 September 2015. Following approval, the Statement of Accounts must be signed and dated by the member presiding at the meeting at which approval is given.
- 4.2 The Audit Committee approved the unaudited accounts for the 2014/15 financial year at their meeting on the 30 June 2015.

5. Key issues and proposals

- 5.1 Issues raised as a result of the audit have now been reflected in a revised Statement of Accounts that will be published by the Council no later than 30 September 2015 and can be accessed via the web site using the following link
